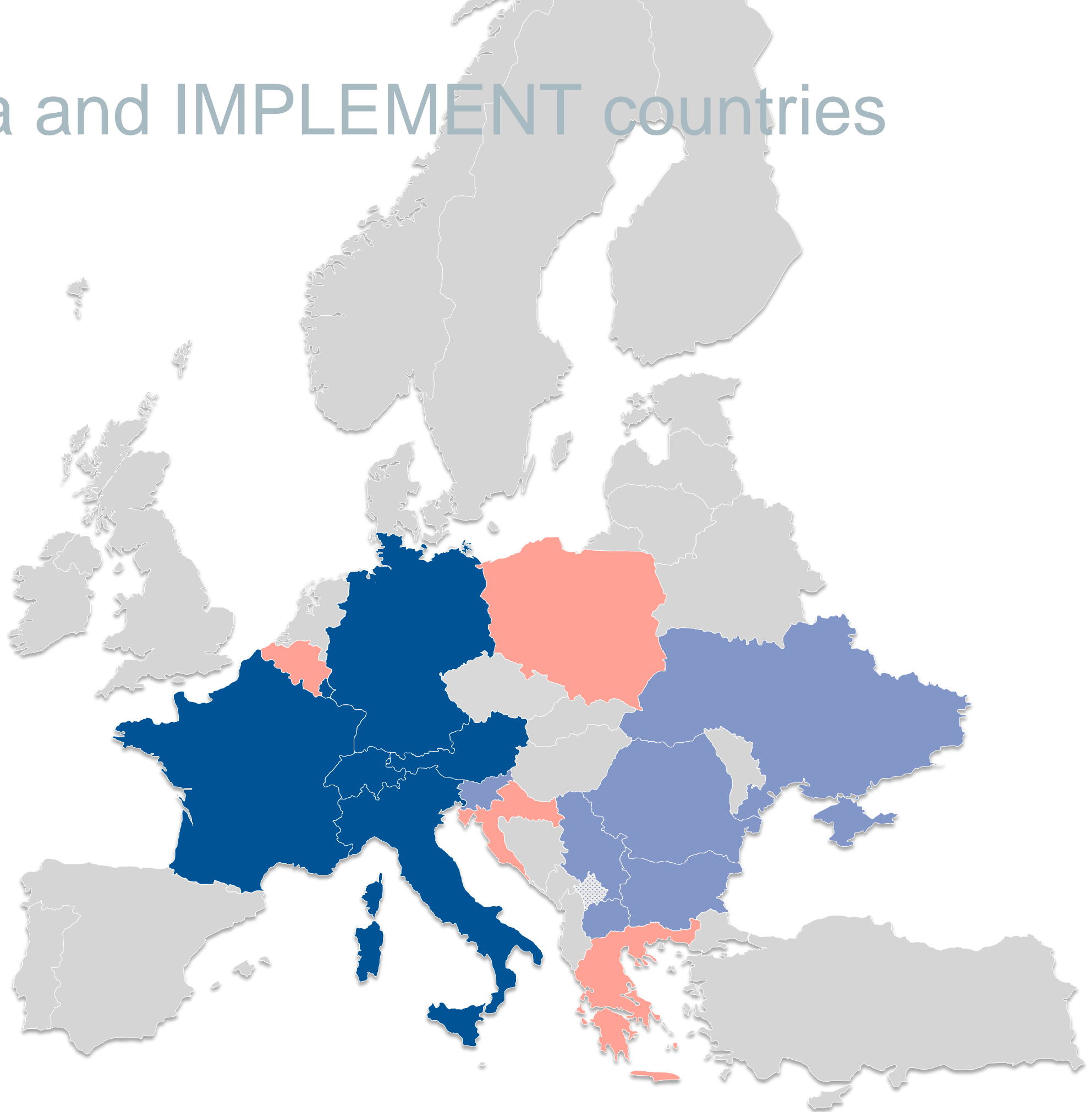

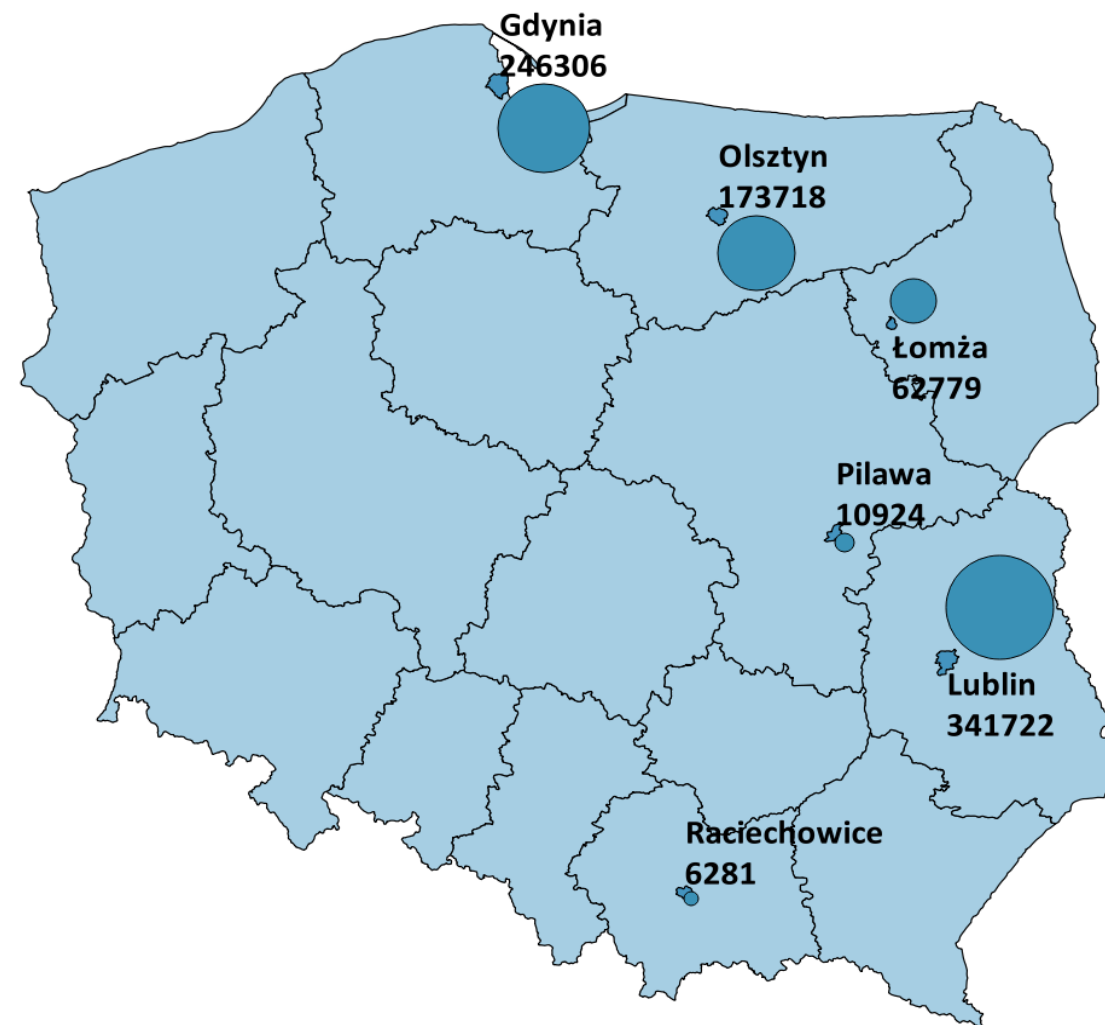
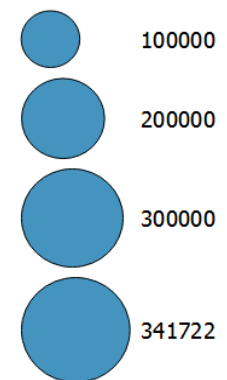
- air quality problems
