



The current rates of renovation of public and private buildings should at least double



Strict enforcement of rules on energy performance of buildings





An integrated Strategy, with an Action Plan to gradually tackle barriers to renovation over time

- Major initiative with a Commission Communication to attract political attention to engage the reforms that are needed
- ✓ Concerted action at <u>all</u> levels, from the local to the regional, national and European
- ✓ Strategic action plan for the years to come

housing, schools and hospitals




Particular attention will be paid to the renovation of social housing, to help households who struggle to pay their energy bills.
