

Eligibility conditions

To be eligible, the applicants (beneficiaries and affiliated entities) must:

- 1. be legal entities (public or private bodies)
- 2. be established in one of the eligible countries:



3. be research centres, institutes, universities, foundations and scientific bodies primarily active in fisheries science or in marine science applied to fisheries management



Consortium composition



Proposals must be submitted by a consortium of at **least 1 applicant** (beneficiaries; not affiliated entities).

The coordinator must be established in an EU Member State.



Duration & Budget of Projects

 Between 18 and 24 months, but proposals with a duration below 18 month or above 24 months can be submitted

 Project budgets (maximum grant amount) are expected to range between EUR 400 000 and EUR 600 000, but proposals requesting other amounts is possible



Requirements

Who can apply?

 Consortium of at least 1 applicant.
Coordinator must be established in an EU Member State.

How much can you get?


- co-funding rate 80%
- 18 -24 months
- 7 projects between € 400,000 and € 600,000 in EU contribution

What are we looking for?

Actions that improve the knowledge available to the EU (and global) fisheries scientific community, thus directly improving the science-base for the conservation and management measures designed in the context of the CFP



Indicative timeline




Evaluation and award procedure

An evaluation committee will assess admissible and eligible proposals

All proposals will be informed about the evaluation result (evaluation result letter)

Relevance

Match themes, priorities and objectives; added-value; cross-border cooperation



Quality

Methodology, feasibility, consortium, cost effectiveness



Impact

Contribution; result integration; dissemination; sustainability; long-term impact

Award criteria	Minimum pass score	Maximum score
Relevance	6	10
Quality	6	10
Impact	6	10
Overall (pass) scores	21	30
