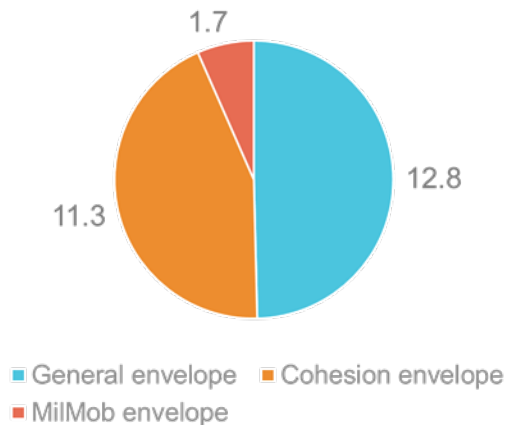

Connecting Europe Facility for Transport (CEF-T)

- CEF-T is the funding instrument to realise European transport infrastructure policy.
- CEF-T focuses on cross-border projects and projects aiming at removing bottlenecks or bridging missing links in various sections of the Core and Comprehensive Network.
- Budget: **€25.81 billion**



- Contribute to the objectives of the **Green Deal** and the **Sustainable and Smart Mobility Strategy**
- Contribute to the development of the **TEN-T**, including adaptation of parts of it for the civilian-defence dual use
- At least **60%** of the financial envelope will be dedicated to the **Union's climate targets**

Funding opportunities in CEF-T for Maritime

- **Alternative Fuels Infrastructure Facility (AFIF):** Recharging/refuelling infrastructure (electricity, H2 and LNG), Maritime and IWW Vessels (electric and H2), LNG bunkering vessels, LNG storage



Open Call with five submission deadlines (3 already closed) :13 April 2023 (under evaluation), **07 November 2023**. Budget (for these 2 cut-off days): **€1.007 billion**

Other Priorities:

- **Motorways of the Sea:** Upgrade of port infrastructure, hinterland connections, dedicated terminals. Facilitation of Short Sea Shipping through ICT platforms, ice-breaking or actions ensuring year-round navigability
- **Maritime Ports:** Facilitation of port access, Basic port infrastructure, Shore-side electricity supply, Port reception facilities for waste from ships, Year-around navigability, Rail/road connections within the port
- **European Maritime Single Window environment (EMSWe)**
- **Vessel Traffic Monitoring and Information Systems (VTMIS)**

New calls will be published after summer 2023, Funding: €5.12 billion, min EU funding/Action: €1million

Funding opportunities in CEF-T for Maritime

Tips:

- Select the call (Core or Comprehensive)
- Explore the possibilities, e.g: OPS can be founded under 3 priorities Ports, MoS, AFIF
- **Synergetic element:** Proposals funded under a CEF-T topic may include synergetic (ancillary) elements relating to another sector of the CEF programme, i.e. energy and digital, if these synergetic elements allow to significantly improve the socio-economic, climate or environmental benefits of the action. Co-funding may be provided as long as the cost of these synergetic elements does not exceed 20% of the total eligible costs of the action.
